Program Sequence

The Doctor of Ministry program is a 62-credit hour, three-year professional practice doctorate. The program incorporates four face-to-face on-campus residency requirements; four on-line courses; and a variety of learning settings which may include regional and international travel depending on chosen cohort specializations. Students are given 12 months advance notice of all required travel. The following table outlines the three-year thematic sequence:
